MARKED AS HIS OWN: THE CIRCUMCISION & BAPTISM OF JESUS AND WHAT THEY MEAN FOR US

January brings with it two often-overlooked but deeply important events in the life of our Lord: the Circumcision and Naming of Jesus (January 1) and the Baptism of Our Lord (First Sunday after Epiphany). Though they appear simple on the surface—an infant's circumcision and a man's baptism—Scripture reveals that both moments are loaded with meaning. They are essential chapters in the story of our salvation.

Why Was Jesus Circumcised?

"At the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb." — Luke 2:21

On the eighth day, Jesus—true God and true Man—was brought under the Law of Moses. Circumcision was the sign of God's covenant with Abraham, the mark placed on every male Israelite. But Jesus had no sin. Why receive a mark meant for sinners?

Because He came to stand in our place.

In His circumcision, Jesus began His lifelong work of fulfilling the Law on our behalf. He submitted Himself to everything God commanded of Israel so that He might redeem Israel—and all nations—from the curse of the Law.

Why Was Jesus Baptized?

"I need to be baptized by You, and do You come to me?" — Matthew 3:14

Jesus answers: "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." — Matthew 3:15

At His circumcision He took the Law upon Himself. At His baptism He takes our sin upon Himself. Jesus steps into the Jordan not to be washed from sin, but to be washed into our place.

What Does This Mean for Us Today?

"For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ." — Galatians 3:27

This means:

- His circumcision counts toward us.
- His baptism benefits us.
- His obedience covers us.
- His Sonship is shared with us.

How This Guides Us Into a New Year

January is often filled with resolutions, fresh starts, and attempts to turn over new leaves. But the Christian does not enter a new year by trying to become a “better version” of oneself. We begin by remembering who we already are in Christ.

1. We begin the year under His Name.
2. We begin the year as forgiven people.
3. We begin the year with confidence, not fear.
4. We begin the year united in Christ.
5. We begin the year as heirs of the promise.

Marked and Claimed in Christ

In January we remember two moments where Jesus allowed Himself to be marked so that we could be claimed: His circumcision and His baptism. Both point to the cross. Both point to our salvation. Both shape how we live every day of this new year.

You belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to you.

We're not getting lost in the holiday rush



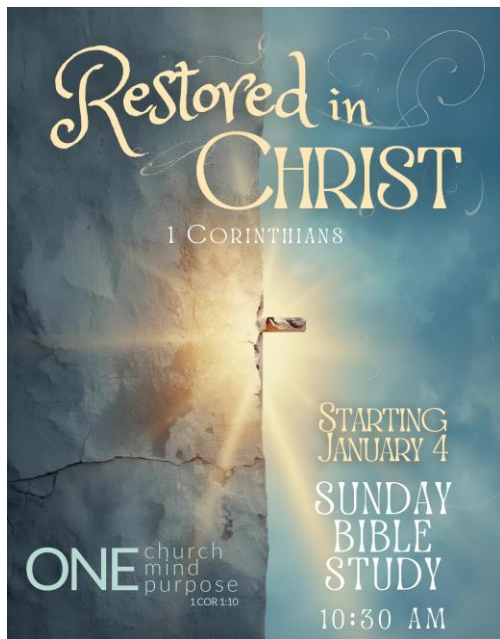

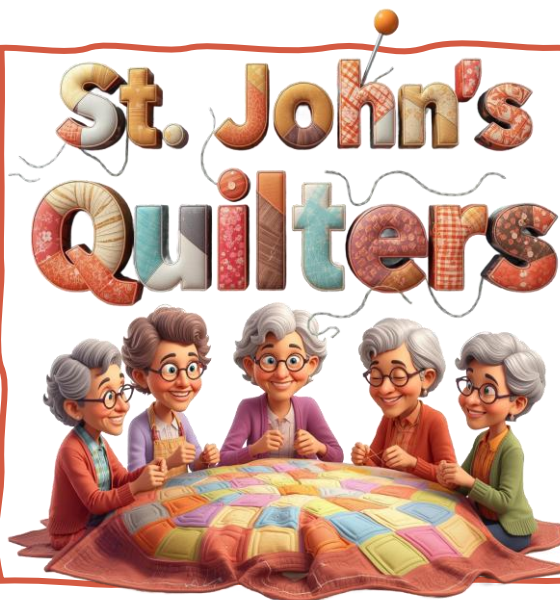
NEW BIBLE STUDY IN JANUARY

TRUSTEE REQUEST: CREATING MORE ENERGY EFFICIENT SPACES

With the new blinds installed and two fully functional HVAC units in place, please use them wisely to help minimize utility costs:

- **Hot summer days:** Lower the blinds to reduce cooling costs.
- **Extreme cold weather:** Keep the blinds down to retain heat.
- **Sunny winter days:** Raise the blinds to let in natural sunlight and warmth.

Please **keep doors to classrooms/sanctuary and the sanctuary curtain open** except when the space is actively in use. Keeping everything closed can prevent the thermostats and HVAC units from working efficiently. The only exception is the office space that are locked when unoccupied.

Thank you for helping us maintain a comfortable environment while keeping energy use efficient.
