

### REJOICE THAT YOUR NAMES ARE WRITTEN IN HEAVEN

While on vacation, the beginning of July, my wife and I attended services at our son's church in Idaho Falls, Idaho. The preacher's text was the Gospel Lesson for the day, Luke 10:1-20, which tells how Jesus sent out the seventy-two to share the good news that "the kingdom of God has come near" (Luke 10:9).

As the pastor started his sermon, he mentioned the fact that that very day was the 10th Anniversary of his ordination into the ministry. I, myself, earlier that week, had celebrated the 40th Anniversary of my ordination. As he applied the text to himself, it was easy for me to apply it to myself. One of the things, the pastor mentioned from the text was that just as there were times when the message seventy-two brought was rejected (Luke 10:11), there are times when the message we bring to others is rejected. The other thing the pastor pointed to was the promise of Jesus: "The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me" (Luke 10:16).

After the service, I had a chance to mention to the pastor that I had recently celebrated my 40th Anniversary in the ministry. Lest you think that is a long time, the pastor who preached for me while I was gone, the Rev. Paul Biegner, later this summer, will be celebrating the 65th Anniversary of his ordination.

When the seventy-two returned to Jesus they were filled with joy, saying, "even the demons are subject to us in your name" (Luke 10:17)! After Jesus said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven," Jesus tells them this: "Do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:18,20).

I think those words are good ones for all of us to remember. Yes, there are going to be times when we feel good because the message we share with others is received with faith. It is good that we can rejoice about that. What is really important, though, what we can really be happy about is that because of the faith in our hearts, our names are written in heaven. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, we have eternal life.




# MANY THANKS TO ALL WHO HELPED AT THE AITKIN COUNTY FAIR

This is an opportunity to become a leader of our church and to assist in growing St. John's and making us a stronger church family. Take the time to familiarize yourself with the duties of each position and prayerfully consider running. We will be voting in these positions at the next Voters' Meeting on October 30. If interested in running for an office please contact Paul Zenke, Chairman, at 218-927-4837 before the October Voters' Meeting. If you have questions about any of the offices, feel free to reach out to those currently in those positions (list of officers are in the Annual Report).

The purpose of this congregation shall be to give honor and glory **MISSION STATEMENT** to the Triune God, to carry out His will, to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all the world, to manifest the unity of our faith in Jesus Christ as God and Savior, to foster Christian fellowship and love, to extend a helping hand to human need, and to achieve its objectives by the preaching of the Word of God, by the administration of the sacraments, and by the religious instruction of all its members according to the confessional standard of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.



### CHURCH COUNCIL MEMBERS: each position is up for re-election

The church council shall provide direction to the congregation on behalf of the voters' assembly.

- The church council shall consist of the congregation's chairman, vice-chairman, \* secretary, treasurer, financial secretary, and the members of each of its boards. The pastor shall be an advisory member of the church council. The chairman and secretary of the congregation shall also serve as the chairman and secretary of the church council.
- \* The church council shall meet a minimum of four times a year. Special meetings of the church council may be called by the chairman, the pastor, or any three members of the church council by providing notice at least 24 hours prior to the meeting.
- The church council members present at a properly called meeting shall constitute a \* quorum.
- The principal duty of the church council shall be to coordinate the program and \* activities of the various boards of the congregation. The church council, however, has no authority to adopt any resolutions binding upon the congregation. the church council shall be reported to the next meeting of the voters' assembly.

### CHURCH COUNCIL MEMBERS

### CHAIRMAN

- Chair all meetings of the congregation, the voters' assembly, and the church council
- Call meetings of the congregation, the voters' assembly, or the church council as regularly scheduled or whenever necessary
- Assist the pastor in the administration of the temporal affairs of the congregation
- Appoint committee members as necessary
- See that the constitution and bylaws are followed
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly

### VICE-CHAIRMAN

- Perform the duties of the chairman during his absence or inability to serve
- Help the chairman carry out his duties
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly

### RECORDING SECRETARY

- Keep a written record of actions of the voters' assembly and the church council in the form of minutes of these meetings
- Keep a written record of all standing resolutions
- Conduct the correspondence of the congregation not otherwise arranged
- Keep an accurate and current roster of the members of the voters' assembly
- Be present at all elections to test the qualifications of candidates if a question should arise
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly

### TREASURER

- Receive the rightful and lawful bills to the congregation and make disbursement by check from congregational funds on authority of the congregation
- Make written quarterly and annual reports to the voters' assembly
- Submit the financial books of the congregation for audit after the close of the fiscal year
- Ask for assistance in completing these assigned tasks as necessary
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly

# CHURCH COUNCIL MEMBERS continued FINANCIAL SECRETARY

- Keep an accurate account of all receipts and deposits
- ❖ Issue offering envelopes, provided by the congregation, to each communicant member
- Record the contributions of members through the offering envelopes on forms provided by the congregation and distribute them on a periodic basis
- Make written annual reports to the church council and written quarterly reports to the voters' assembly
- ❖ Ask for assistance in completing these assigned tasks as necessary
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly.

### BOARD OF FINANCE: two seats open for re-election

- Receive all contributions for the congregation, and see to their prompt deposit in a bank designated by the voters' assembly;
- Make weekly written reports to the Treasurer, Financial Secretary, and church office of deposits made.

# BOARD OF TRUSTEES: one (possibly two) seats open for re-election

- ❖ Be concerned with and responsible for the maintenance and repair of real and personal property of the congregation (this does NOT mean you are responsible for repairs, but instead contacting someone to repair things as necessary)
- Take such action as may be necessary in an emergency to protect the property and interest of the congregation
- Arrange proper insurance coverage for the congregational properties and make any necessary reports and recommendations to the voters' assembly
- Regulate the use of all congregational facilities by organizations of the congregation, individual members, and non-member individuals or groups
- ❖ Make proper and adequate arrangements for the housing of the pastor and his family
- Attend to the business matters of the congregation, including the signing of all legal documents
- Perform such other duties as assigned by the voters' assembly



## BOARD OF DEACONS: two seats open for re-election

- Assist the pastor in all spiritual matters of the congregation, in particular to cultivate peace, harmony and love among the members, to assist in the pastoral care of the sick, the needy, and such as are negligent in worship participation or the use of the Sacraments
- Ensure that the worship services are conducted decently and in order, that the Gospel is preached in its purity and in accord with sound Lutheran doctrine, and that all instruction, religious or secular, is in accord with the Word of God
- Make provision for pastoral care and services in the absence, sickness, or disability of the pastor or in times of pastoral vacancy
- Assist the pastor in the administration of the Sacraments in whatever ways are considered necessary and mutually agreeable
- Devise and foster ways by which guests and visitors are sincerely welcomed and made to feel at home in the congregation
- Promote personal witnessing among the members and organize outreach into the community of the congregation
- ❖ Direct and supervise the incorporation of new members and make every effort to bring them into the life and work of the congregation
- ❖ Approve all special services, entertainments, performances, or any other functions planned for presentation to the congregation or general public or to any society or organization
- Supervise the music staff
- Supervise the altar guild in the care, use, and maintenance of all items such as communion ware, chancel furnishings, banners, vestments, etc.
- Consider cases of church discipline and bring them to a satisfactory conclusion or bring them to the attention of the voters' assembly in accordance with Matthew 18
- Exercise leadership in gathering call lists and calling a new pastor when a vacancy occurs
- Be concerned about the spiritual, emotional, and physical welfare of the pastor(s) and his family (adequate compensation, housing, free time, vacation, assistance in times of illness) and specifically review these items annually
- ❖ Assist the pastor(s) in processing changes of membership among congregation membership
- Pray for the pastor(s) and other spiritual leaders and encourage them in their work by word and action
- Train and supervise the ushers
- Review and recommend salary changes to the voters' assembly

# TOGETHER IN NEWS FROM THE MISSION NEUENDORFS

We recently received the following from James and Christel Neuendorf:

Every Sunday in Mayaguez at Principe de Paz after the Divine Service, we have a bible study, currently on the book of John in the fellowship hall. On Pentecost, we moved the bible study to the river! Since it was Pentecost, we studied the third article of the catechism, "I believe in the Holy Spirit." We discussed how the Holy Spirit begins and sustains our faith, "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit". 1 Cor. 12:3. Following the study, church visitor, Carlos cooked a soup on an outdoor grill and we swam in the river. The church picnic and bible study at the river was well received that we had bible study at a river again last Sunday.

During the summer, Evangelist William Torres has been giving private lesson to one of his English students. This student and her family have started to attend our fellowship night at church in Mayaguez. Her family runs a summer camp for kids ages 5 to 15, that is held at the local baseball stadium. After learning about our program for kids, she invited William to come read a bible story. The entire Mayaguez team and some church members went to help with the event. William's son choose the story of Noah's Ark for us to read to the kids. After finishing the story we played games and asked questions about the story. It was a wonderful way to connect with our community and share the Gospel with these children.

During our fellowship nights [at Ponce], along with a worship service and playing games we do crafts. For the month of June in Ponce, the crafts have been things that can be used during or after a hurricane and are things that would be useful in an emergency response kit. One week we made candle in old food cans, and another week made insect repellent. We ask that you help us pray for an uneventful hurricane season."
